

# **PRE-TEEN CAMP COUNSELORS DUTIES AND EXPECTATIONS**

Being a counselor is a servant-oriented ministry that requires the counselor to give him- or herself over to the needs and spiritual development of the campers.

## **Duties of the Senior Counselor (a Senior Counselor must be 18 or older)**

- Supervise his or her cabin
- Direct the Junior Counselors and the Counselors in Training (including helping to develop counselor skills in both)
- Lead cabins in activities and duties (i.e. cabin clean-up, quiet time, k.p., rec., crafts, meadow moments, cabin devo, camp clean-up and classes)
- Lead worship (as skilled)
- Play an active role in the Kingdom Walk
- Write notes to his or her campers

## **Duties of the Junior Counselor (Junior Counselor must be 16 years or older, or must have served as a C.I.T for at least two years)**

- Supervise his or her cabin
- Listen and learn from his or her Senior Counselor
- Help lead cabins in activities and duties (i.e. cabin clean-up, quiet time, k.p., rec., crafts, meadow moments, cabin devo, camp clean-up and classes)
- Lead worship (as skilled)
- Play an active role in Kingdom Walk
- Write notes to his or her campers

## **Duties of the Counselor in Training (a C.I.T. must already have had one year out of pre-teen camp)**

- Listen and learn from his or her Senior Counselor
- Help with cabin duties
- Lead cabins in k.p.
- Direct Canteen
- Write notes to his or her campers

## **Expectations of Counselors and Counselors in Training**

- Lead by example (i.e. they will do everything alongside their campers)
- Learn campers' names to the best of their abilities
- Follow and enforce the rules of camp
- Regularly spend time with the campers
- Be in cabins for cabin devos and lights out and remain for the rest of the night (this includes the last night)
- Through speech and conduct, promote spiritual thinking
